

## Generic Assessment Strategies

Rubrics used in assessing writing typically list expectations for content, organization, vocabulary, voice, sentence structure, and conventions. Rubric scores tell you about your degree of success in completing a writing task. They have an even more important function, however—to help you improve your writing.

Rubrics included in this book have been written in student-friendly language so you can assess your own writing and your classmates'. Just as with the planning and revision strategies in this book, you can use a double approach to assessment. Combine the generic rubric with the specific rubric for the writing form of your composition.

As you use rubrics to assess your own and others' writing, set personal writing goals. Use each rubric to make helpful changes that will improve your writing.
